**Level:** introductory, the course is for anyone intending to become a teacher.

**Course structure:** four units, each comprising short videos, practical tasks using digital resources, forums and discussions, live activities, events, going further.

**Assessment:** end of unit quizzes and digital badges, course certificate on completion of the course.
